



# CLIENT DEMOGRAPHICS






Of the nonadmissions, only 13 individuals were diverted to the ED due to safety risk or medical instability.

- Re-admissions (minimal) and crisis
   follow-ups (vast majority) make up about
   18% of encounters
- Data from our Mercy ED collaboration shows an ED behavioral health readmission rate of 36%
- While we are still early in the program, we are hopeful we are seeing a reduction in re-admissions due to our process of connection to follow-up care



#### Behavioral Health Encounters as of November 2020

FIRST FIVE MONTHS OF 2020 (PRIOR TO BCC OPENING)



Reduction in behavioral health encounters compared to the average of the previous three years during the same timeframe LAST FIVE MONTHS OF 2020 (AFTER BCC OPENING)



26.4% reduction in behavioral health encounters compared to the average of the previous three years during the same timeframe



One month showed a 42% reduction over the three-year average

## COMMUNITY/PARTNER IMPACT

**Mercy Emergency Department** 

#### **Efficiency of ED Behavioral Health Response Staff**

By working with Triage and quickly transferring clients to the BCC, post-restraint average length of stay has reduced by 10 hours and time to follow-up behavioral health assessment has reduced by an average of four hours

**Average Check-In to Admission Assessment Completion** 

Less than 60 minutes

Provided Benefits Assistance (including Medicaid Application Assistance)



# Community Savings

	2016	2017
Hospital Care & Emergency Transport	\$1.15M	\$1.99M
Law Enforcement & Detention Services	\$1.22M	\$821K
Total Cost Avoidance	\$2.37M	\$2.81M

Annual cost avoidance to hospitals, EMS, and law enforcement agencies was approximately \$2.3M in 2016 and \$2.8M in 2017.
